The Danger Assessment Tool

The Danger Assessment is an instrument that helps to determine the level of danger an abused woman has of being killed by her intimate partner. The tool was originally developed by Jacquelyn Campbell (1986) with consultation and content validity support from battered women, shelter workers, law enforcement officials, and other clinical experts on battering.

Training Overview

This training session will give participants an overview on the lethality assessment, the data supporting the accuracy of the Danger Assessment, how to administer the Danger Assessment with victim/survivors, the weighted scoring for the Danger Assessment, the resulting levels of danger, and what kinds of safety strategies might be recommended at each level.

Participants will be eligible for certification in the Danger Assessment at the completion of the session and will receive directions on how to obtain and use the certification.

Please note: There is an additional \$25 charge for certification. That fee is paid at a later time by the participant.
