Prior to becoming the FBI Minneapolis Infragard Coordinator in January 2015 John was the FBI Airport Liaison Agent Coordinator at Minneapolis International Airport (MSP) for FBI Minneapolis where he investigated matters ranging from crimes aboard aircrafts, airport insider threats, suspicious activity, and counterterrorism.</p> <p><i>Chris Veltsos, Professor, Department of Computer Information Science at Minnesota State University, Mankato</i> Chris Veltsos is a professor in the Department of Computer Information Science at Minnesota State University, Mankato where he regularly teaches Information Security and Information Warfare classes. Beyond the classroom, Chris is also very active in the security community, engaging with community groups and advising business leaders on how to best manage information security risks.</p>
