2023 SUMMARY

message from the executive director

Dear MAC Members and Allies:

As I sit down to write this year-end message I am filled with a lot of mixed emotions. Fiscal Year 2023 was very successful for the Minnesota Alliance on Crime (MAC) and leaves us with many opportunities to improve the landscape of victim services.

During FY23 MAC board and staff neared the completion of our next 3-year strategic plan which centers equity and increases connections with member programs, board of directors, allied partners, and persons impacted by crime. As part of the processes, MAC convened member programs and allies to establish consensus regarding MAC's mission,



vision, and core values. The outcome of those rich conversations resulted in clarified and concise organizational identity statements. You can find them in this report. We believe that building consensus around who MAC is today, what we want to achieve in the future, and the values that will guide our work, strengthens the collective impact who will have across the state.

MAC worked tirelessly, in collaboration with our five relative coalitions, during the 2023 Legislative Session. While 2023 saw some meaningful policy and funding bills be signed into law, we did not get the much needed and sustaining funding increase to the Crime Victim Services (CVS) fund. We received just enough to make funding over the next biennium somewhat stable, but the funding cliff is still on the horizon. MAC will continue to work with our relative coalitions, allied partners, and member programs to realize an increase in CVS funding that will ensure the sustainability of support and services for everyone who is impacted by crime.

MAC continued to work to enhance victims' rights in Minnesota in FY23. MAC provided testimony in support of many bills during the 2023 Legislative session that resulted in stronger laws, streamlined processes, and more equitable outcomes not just for those impacted by crime, but for those Minnesotans who live at the margins of our communities. MAC also implemented a 201 Fundamentals in Victim Services track and other trainings that MAC members indicated were needed to grow their capacity to made Higher Contributions.

I am extremely grateful to our funders, donors, member programs, collaborative partners, and allies for your continued support. Together we are improving the response, services, and support that those impacted by crime in Minnesota need and deserve. MAC will be relying on increased financial support from donors during FY24, as we know the state and federal funding landscape is ever shifting and unstable.

2023 STRATEGIC GOALS

MANIFESTING OUR MISSION

- The staff, board, and membership continued our planned work by engaging Naaima Khan, Principal Consultant at Create Good to work with us to update our mission, vision, and values to better reflect our future plans and who we want to be as a collective organization working to advance the rights for victims in Minnesota.
- Successfully completed a new strategic planning process through hosting events with board, staff, membership, and stakeholders over the last 12-months to create an updated strategic plan that reflects our values and how we want to envision our work as an anti-racist, inclusive organization that supports all victims of crime in the ways that support the best healing.
- Spent time working on the collective history of MAC, collecting stories and people who made MAC what it is over the last 30 years. In order to ground ourselves in both recognizing and honoring the past and working towards a future where we can continue to improve the lives of victims of crime in Minnesota.

DEVELOPING AND INCREASING MAC MEMBERSHIP

- Staff participated in diverse online collaborative workgroups to build relationships with allies and stakeholders.
- 2022 Annual meeting was well-attended by members who set MAC's priorities for the next fiscal year, revised the bylaws, and engaged in voting on strategic planning.
- MAC hosted over 30 webinars, workshops, and training sessions for members throughout the year.
- MAC convened eight online regional membership meetings to engage member programs in networking and pertinent issuefocused discussions to better serve victims in their region.

2023 STRATEGIC GOALS

ENGAGING STAKEHOLDERS

- MAC works in collaboration with local, state, national, and allied partners to increase the support and information available to all victims of crime.
- MAC meets regularly with other statewide criminal-legal stakeholders to identify and discuss emerging issues affecting crime victims.
- MAC meets monthly with other state crime victim service coalition directors to ensure collaboration and communication state-wide and locally.
- MAC increased our presence online with website upgrades, an increase in social media traffic, and newsletter sign-ups.
- MAC continues to work with local colleges and universities to train and develop students interested in the work of supporting victims' rights.

DEVELOPING AND SUSTAINING CORE PROGRAMS

- Provided over 75 hours of training for over 600 individual members, allies, and community groups.
- Our three-day Fundamentals in Victim Services training in January 2023 and June 2023 assisted over 30 advocates in strengthening their advocacy skills with crime victims.
- Our three-day Fundamentals 201 in March 2023 assisted over 30 advocates in strengthening their advanced advocacy skills
- Fulfilled over 100 technical assistance requests from over 55 members and allied programs throughout Minnesota.
- Our electronic newsletter reached over 1100 professionals in the field each month with the latest news from the field, resources, and training opportunities to advance all professionals skills within the field.
- We continue to offer fully online programming and have slowly incorporated in-person events like Fundamentals in Victim Services.






